- Fortress Numbers: Tom Holland;
 - BCPC and National are utilizing the numbers that are provided by DND and obtained from Fortress. These are the numbers being used by BCPC Treasurer for the buget planning.
- 8) Address: Major Brent Deck SO2 Air- RCSU Update
 - Greetings on behalf of the New Commander Commander Rod Hughes, he sends his regrets for not being able to attend.
- a)Changes at PAC Region:
 - LCol Kip Kippel "ages" out in November, also retiring in Nov. O9will be Major Chris Tuck.
 - New: Capt Linda Hildebrand Albert Head CO
 - Air office Capt Kurt Paulekat will leaving to take assignment in Afghanistan.
 - WO Mark Glowach-is the new ACA replacing MWO Furlotte. For Sqn's in the North / Van Island
 - Local support allocation; (LSA) Governed by two documents: CATO 1734 / PRCI 613
- These documents explain how to go about applying for the LSA funding.
- Funds available are \$600 per sqn/ 15 per cadet calculated in fortress.

- The CF 51 requires CO'S and Chair's signature
 - Please note: LY there was \$85,000 allocated, between squadrons only spent \$32,000.
 - Claims have gone to a Direct fund transfer all sponsors are asked to submit a direct deposit forms, reason it is less costly and it is quicker in getting funds reimbursed.

- Change in the working rank of the CIC will go from the rank of Captain to rank of Lt. At a squadron level the maximum rank an individual can attain is LT. Only Commanding officers and training officers can attain a Captains rank. Ranks will not be taken down once they have been attained.
 - Summer camps Nationally 10,000 spots available. BC Aprox 12% of Country Population.
 - LY 1282 summer camps given to BC. Based on the size of the Sqn, is what determines the # of summer camps a squadron has. This is an annual calculation.
- Last year 1023 changes -80% overall turnover.
 - LY there were not enough spares-that had the qualification for selected camp.
 - Major Deck emphasized the importance of the qualifying of the cadets that are sent to camps.
 - Advanced aviation technology replaced aircraft maintenance.
 - Another issue for cadets t raveling to camp was the lack of gov't issued
- photo ID 's for travelling.
- c) New Training Program Update
 - CPU level 1 has now been implemented 01sep08 New Training course will be called General Training, (GT)
 - Basic course will not be offered replaced by general training
 - Phase 1- mandatory training consists of 2/3 of training.
 - Complimentary training consists of 1/3 of training
 - Regional directed activities first aid comp/ band comp
 - National directed activities national biathlon, etc.
 - Optional training
 - Summer training
 - There is a need to make the program appeal to a larger niche of young people:
 - The program is geared towards a trainee centered vs instructor centered program.
 - The program is moving towards a more hands on and self directed learning.

9) Address: LCol Kippel RCOPS – RGS Comox

- Statistics- summer went well only gliding school to finish on time. No Accidents, the only Gliding school to finish on time, mostly due to good staff and good weather.
- Read a letter of "Thanks" that was emailed from Sanchit Sharma –CO Award winner Glider Cadet.
- This Year lots of noise complaints with reference to flying at Comox organized groups have been campaigning to have the gliding /flying stopped.
- LCol Kippel address concerns and dealt with them directly through out the summer. Sincere attempts to cooperate and appease to the best of the Flying Schools ability. RGS is trying to come up with a general aptitude test to give to cadets before they come to RGS for their training.
- *a) Pilot retention program*: BC Provincial Committee has come through with assistance in Pilot retention: DND was asked for funds for coming out and helping to fly, DND had regulations that prohibited them from doing so.
 - There have been 38 front and rear seat check outs since this program started:
- \$300 rear seat check out
- \$175 front seat check out
 - b) Advance soaring program is now being put in place to assist them in gaining hours and instill continued interest in Gliding.
- Fly Stats 6300 flights down from LY's of 7000
- 1 glider accident –
- Wilga Update good plane, just no original parts available due to the factor being shut down. Up for sale now. L19 Update.
- Overview of status of various tow planes and gliders
- Maintenance: RGS has finally gotten approval money for a paint booth; however it is on the back burner for now because of plans for base expansion, etc... will continue to try getting it to happen.
- DND has purchased 4 winches, they will be in Canada and delivered from US by 16th of March. LCol Gaberau will be giving one to Comox.
- Comox is first on the list to get one of the new winches- there are details to work out to get the operation and management of the winch program into place.

Call for Motion: made by Jack Henwood to adopt the budget proposal for 2008/2009 which calls for a cadet assessment fee of \$100 per cadet.

Q1 - Robin Hart – GV Wing chair

Please speak with reference to the \$ 32,000 contribution to be sent to National for

support.

AI – Geoffrey Johnston

- The proposed \$32,000 to National is a Contingency fund for National.

-BCPC is prepared to send a contingency fund to National and therefore has demanded that National provide the provinces with the support & services required, such as web based training for volunteers,

-Provinces have demanded that National provide services to Provinces and Sponsoring committee training – competent web based system for reporting

-This is also to cover any legal cases, example of one in progress in Ontario as we speak. -National has just informed us that a Centennial of Flight Pin has been approved and the cost will be born by Provincial committees approximately: \$1.00 per cadet

-Budget has built in a provision for what costs will be put to the provincial committees from National. BCPC is planning for this.

Q 2– Chris Gurnet 531 Sponsoring committee

• Is there currently \$100,000 in cash reserves?

A2-Jack Henwood : currently there is \$75,000 cash reserve at year end, Aug 31. Jack likes to have 2-3 months of cash reserves for any unexpected expenses arising, etc..

Q3 – Chris Gurnet: Where does the gaming money go if BCPC gets it?

A 3– Jack Henwood: Gaming is specifically earmarked for allocated areas of the program by Gaming. Two programs that Gaming supports: Flying program and Effective speaking program.

Q4 - Jocelyn Crevel – 744 Cowichan League Representative

• Concern with increase is those that are having difficulties meeting current assessment fees. How do we see these committees will meet the proposed increase?

A4 – Tom Holland: recognizing that all units put in many hours to collect the necessary assessment fee, BCPC is now using the term "registration fee". Giving committee the ability to call it what it is. BCPC is formatting a "form: to be sent out to all sponsoring committee giving them the ability to collect these as "registration fees". This form will be called "BCPC Registration Fee".

There will be two lines, one for the Assessment fee to BCPC and one for the Sponsoring committee's registration fee. It is hoped that this will remove the burden of collection from the Sponsoring committees and but the onus on the BC Provincial Committee.

Form will be ready to implement by January 1, 2009.

Q5 - Linda Amelia – 363 Campbell River

• Some of the numbers on the budget have doubled, why have these numbers such as Provincial AGM, National Awards, Scholarship and selection boards, etc increased?

A5- Jack Henwood Provincial AGM cost increase, it was felt that getting more League Reps to attend and covering a portion of their expenses.

A5 – Linda Spouler: BCPC wanted to offer reimbursement for expenses for our League repsentatives they are in a "no mans land" Sponsoring committees are encouraged to budget these expenses and the League reps don't have this option. For League reps AGM Registration fee & accommodation cost has been factored into the increase.

A5 – Jack Henwood: National AGM – because our impact at the National level, of travel cost increases and the need to send BCPC Members to the National level, there are 3 Governors and other BCPC members that are needed to represent BC at the National Level, who also participate on the various A 5– *Tina Kirkpatrick*(In charge of Boards) The increase in fuel prices, traveling to various Wings for review boards, upcoming changes in review boards, with additional opportunities for Cadets, there may be more boards required; all this has been factored into these increases.

- With reference to the Wings Expenses increases, there are now two additional Wings in the Fraser Valley and it was felt that it is important to reimburse volunteers for expenses. League Reps work for

Q6 – Linda Amelia: When the Wilga is sold is the money to go into this general revenue?

A6 - Jack Henwood: When the Wilga is sold the funds will stay in the flying program, the loan will be paid off and excess will remain in the flying program and not go into general revenue.

Q7 - Jim Turner - 103 Sponsoring Chair

Comments: Thanks and recognizes the hard work required to present a budget such as this and acknowledges the hard work put into it by BCPC.

 Question: if in fact the gaming funds are acquired (as they have prudently not been included into the budget) could the excess or surplus of the assessment funds then be returned to the sponsoring committees next year?

Q8 - 747 Mark Beaupre

Who gets to vote on the budget?

A8 – Tom Holland: By our constitution all voting members BCPC in good standing, who currently hold a voting card.

78 Total voting members / 46 Sponsoring committees / 32 Members

Q9 – Mark Beaupre: Why do we have to start this now? Why the budget can't be put in place in 2009 September.

A9-Jack Henwood: If we don't implement this budget now, we will be out of funds by 2009. *A9 – Geoffrey Johnston:* because of the timing of the AGM and the voting process, it is difficult to

resolve the timing of the budget implementation.

By having the budget input for 2009, we will have to cut back. Discussion

Q10- Mark Beaupre: Can we not implement this in 2009?

A10- Geoffrey: We will deteriorate the cash balance of the League, we will have to cut back in a lot of areas. Which we have already implemented. The desire is to maintain this increase for longer than a year.

Tom Holland Comment:

We have already adopted as directors of BCPC:

Next year the budget will be established by the mid year Open Directors meeting in April, so that it can be sent out to the Sponsors for May 1, giving time to the Sponsoring committees to process proposed budget and to allow them to start planning their budget earlier.

Q11 - 637 Chu Wu - Vice Chair: Comments of great Treasurer's report: Compliments on the format of the presented budget:

 Question: Can we get Ken Higgins, as Governor to speak to National level so that the sponsoring committees have the tool to make this a required registration fee. Would like to have Ken influence National and encourage DND to remove the "FREE" out of National DND level?

A11- Jack Henwood: most of this is how the sponsoring committee market the Fee.

A11 – Geoffrey Johnston: this proposal is in the strategic plan update (D6) at the National level, this is approximately a year away to from approval.

Q12 - 676 Rod Seginson: comments, this budget is reported well, and is informative.

- Concerns with some of the doubling of some of the line items.
- Can we demonstrate as an organization as a Provincial committee will do some "belt tightening"?
- There is some evidence of belt tightening, but it is in the cadet related expenses.
- Office Administration is one area that could use review, having said that, Rod's comment was that having Ilona in the office is one of the best things for this organization.

A12 - Jack Henwood: cadet related activities: flying, engine over haul, maintenance of aircraft, we don't attempt to belt tighten in the cadet related area. We make sure that the program

- We recognize that the biggest expense is the way we changed how we do business in the office we can belt tighten all we want, but we need to consider if this is the area to tighten. It takes a lot of work to run an organization of this size. Jack assured that he is looking after these

Comments - 676 - Rod Seginson: Final comment that his committee is concerned with the fee increase, Proposal at this meeting we could show and propose a lower fee.

Comments: 754 Nancy Chapman

- Overview by one of their members and the explanation and reasoning of these increases.
- When increases happen so quickly, why can't BCPC look at proposing increasing the fee over a 3 year term, more of an incremental increase?
- In the future can this be done?
- Comment: Some of the budget expenses could be explained better to the sponsoring committee so that they can understand why these increases are being proposed.

Response: Tom Holland:

- Some of the expense is relate to the management and hiring of the Office Administrator.
- As mentioned earlier, next April, at the Directors Semi Annual meeting a proposed budget will be presented and distributed earlier in the year before the next training year.

Q13 – 111 Dewey Yang / Treasurer

- Can you tell us if you have some guideline for reimbursement for travel expenses?
 Currently our sponsoring assessment is \$100.00 of which 75 currently goes to BCPC
- Why can't the bcpc assess on the actual
- A13- Tom Holland: There is a Travel Policy in the BCPC Administrative manual.

Q14 - 747 Judy Tarron

- BCPC is basing the fee for this year on last year's number. Why can't BCPC collect based on last year's numbers?

A15- Tom Holland: We are currently working in this year. The budget is set for the next training year; August 31, 2008-2009 . This is the form that we work on, if the members approve the budget, then the budget is implemented.

Tom Holland called for the motion: Vote on budget as proposed

Ron Rique: Question in reference to the displacement of squadrons during the Olympics? Answer: Several units in Richmond and Vancouver. Ron requested the support of the BCPC and DND in approaching VANOC to assist in covering cost difference for these units.
