Tagging General Rules

- BCPC has long recognized the reduction and restrictions that landowners/landlords have put on charity groups doing fund raising on their properties.
- When an organization such as the Air Cadet League starts fighting within itself for the perceived carrot across the border, we create the risk of being barred from that mall and many others. Sponsoring committees must communicate with each other - they are expected to run their committees in a cooperative business-like manner.
- Squadrons are to fundraise within the normal area where their unit parades (i.e. North Burnaby would tag only at North Burnaby businesses).

Tagging General Rules

- Where there are multiple squadrons in an area (i.e. Richmond – 609, 655 and 692) – they are expected to discuss amongst each other which dates they will tag and must respect those squadron tagging dates.
- It is suggested that if there are other discipline cadets (i.e. Navy and Army) in the same geographical area, that the Air Cadet Squadron advise the other disciplines of their tagging dates.
- Fundraising is the sponsoring committee's responsibility. The organizing and planning is not the function of the Commanding Officer or his staff.

Tagging General Rules

- Many malls are owned and operated by the same company, and do discuss charity groups that request the use of their space to fund raise. When problems occur; for what ever reason, the malls create more guidelines to reduce or restrict all fund raising on their property. Most malls favour local needs, provincial needs, or national needs of organizations which are in fact popular, charity that help the less fortunate.

The Air Cadet League is not regarded as a needy group or totally popular due the military appearance. Our members are not in bad health nor are they poor in most cases.

Businesses who do know the Air Cadet program do expect the League to be better disciplined in handling its own affairs.

Cadet groups have been barred from malls in the past for this very issue of crossing the 'border'.

Squadron Tagging Boundaries

Boundary settings for Lower Mainland / Greater Vancouver
/ Metro Vancouver / Fraser Valley

- **819 Skyhawk - North Delta Squadron** is located at 84th and 114th. Proximity to Scott Road is 6 blocks. The only business corridor for this sqn is 120th. Based on the geographical size of North Delta, 819 should be allowed to tag not only in North Delta but BOTH sides of Scott Road (120th) to Hwy #10 to the south and 96th Avenue to the north. The Wal-Mart located at 122 and 88th avenue can be used once a year (either spring or fall – to be decided between 767 and 819).
- **767 Dearman – Whalley** is located at 108th and King George Highway. The Wal-Mart located at 122nd and 88th can be used for tagging once a year only – to be decided between 767 and 819 for either spring or fall. Dearman tagging area will comprise of east of 124th to 160th; north from Hwy 10 to 108th.

Squadron Tagging Boundaries

- **513 Hornet – New Westminster** is located in Queens Park. Due to growth of the Queenborough Corridor (Wal-Mart) – they will no longer be able to tag into south Coquitlam (Lougheed to Schoolhouse and north to Austin Avenue). South of Highway 1 to Queenborough Corridor. East of 10th Avenue to the Fraser River.
- **754 Phoenix – Port Moody/Coquitlam**. Can tag east of North Road to the west side of Westwood Avenue. They can also recruit at Coquitlam Centre once a year.
- **777 Neptune – Port Coquitlam** can tag east side of Westwood with the exception of the Real Canadian Superstore at Westwood and Lougheed (the west side of Westwood). They can also recruit at Coquitlam Centre once a year.

Squadron Tagging Boundaries

- **907 White Rock – White Rock** can tag south of Hwy 99. East to 176th.
- **828 Hurricane Squadron** located at 1720 - 56 Street in Tsawwassen can tag in the South Delta communities of Tsawwassen and Ladner.
- **609 Steveston, 655 Richmond and 692 BCIT** are not allowed to tag in the Queensborough corridor or in South Vancouver.
- **746 Lightninghawk** - east of 176th to 272nd. North of Hwy 10 to 88th Avenue.
- **583 Coronation** - can tag east of the Pitt River Bridge to 287th.

Squadron Tagging Boundaries

- **521 Mission** – can tag east of 287th to Sylvester Road and south to the Fraser River.
- **861 Abbotsford** - can tag south of the Fraser River to the US border and east of 272 to Vedder Channel.
- **147 Chilliwack** – can tag east of Vedder Channel to Hope.
- **759 North Burnaby** – can tag east to North Road and west to Boundary Road. North of Highway 1.
- **637 South Burnaby** – can tag East of Boundary Road to 10th Avenue. South of Highway 1 to the Fraser River.

Squadron Tagging Boundaries

- **Vancouver Squadrons** - are not to cross Boundary Road to the east, Fraser River to the south and Lions' Gate and Ironworker's Memorial Bridges to the North.
- **North and West Vancouver Squadrons** – are not to cross the Lions' Gate and Ironworkers' bridges to the south. They will have to determine their own boundaries between West and North Vancouver.
